

Better Off in School

Encouraging students to regularly attend school for academic success

The importance of regular school attendance cannot be overstated. School attendance serves as a fundamental indicator of students' academic success and engagement.

The following information highlights the significance of regular school attendance—especially during the month of September—and its impact on students, their peers and the overall educational environment.

1. Early Indicator of Success:

- School attendance is an important indicator of academic success.

- 2. Strong Start, Strong Year:

 - Missing just two to four days in September increases the likelihood of chronic absenteeism, negatively affecting graduation rates.

3. Long-Term Impact:

- Chronic absenteeism, which is defined as missing more than 10 per cent of school days, is associated with poor performance, lower graduation rates and long-term negative outcomes.
- High absentee rates are an early sign of disengagement and have adverse academic consequences.
- Chronic absenteeism in early grades delays reading proficiency, leading to academic struggles in later years.
- Chronic absenteeism is a stronger indicator of potential dropout than test scores.
- 4. Negative Impact on Others:
 - Lack of school attendance can negatively impact not only students who are frequently absent but also their peers.
 - Teachers must adapt classroom instructions to accommodate absent students, which can hinder the overall learning experience for other students in the classroom.

5. Post-Pandemic Challenges:

- The COVID-19 pandemic led to a significant drop in school attendance worldwide, including Nova Scotia.
- While in-person learning has resumed, attendance recovered but is still below prepandemic norms.



6. Collaborative Efforts:

- Encouraging regular school attendance requires the collective support of parents, families, teachers and administrators.
- Raising awareness about the importance of consistent attendance empowers almost everyone to provide the necessary support to students.
